



TN Becomes 50th State to pass Insurance Mandate (August 2019)


Autism Insurance Reform in 49 States

Autism Speaks commends Tennessee as it becomes 50th state requiring that insurance plans cover autism

Reforms eliminate restrictions and gaps in coverage of medically necessary autism care

NEW YORK (August 3, 2019) - After more than a decade of advocacy by Autism Speaks, volunteer autism advocates and partners in the disability community, Tennessee is now the 50th state to take action clarifying that state-regulated health benefit plans must cover all medically necessary treatment for autism. On August 1, the Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance issued a bulletin requiring all individual, small and large group plans to cover medically necessary care for autism, including applied behavior analysis (ABA).






The highly anticipated auction for **Autism**Learning Partners has concluded,
commanding north of \$270 million through a
sale to FFL Partners. The transaction
represents the vertical's largest-ever sponsor
deal, according to sources familiar with the situation.

The sellers include **Jefferson River Capital**, the family office of **Blackstone** President and COO **Tony James**, and **Scopia Capital Management**, which prior to the sale owned a combined interest of about 70 percent, two sources said. The stake of ALP's earliest investor, **Great Point Partners**, stood at close to 20 percent prior to the deal, they said.

The transaction, valued between \$270 million and \$280 million, follows what was said to be a robust sales process conducted by **Berkery Noyes & Co**, as previously reported by *Buyouts*. The auction kicked off in mid-2017, producing around 20 indications of interest in its early stages, one of the sources said.
